

## **ACCREDITATION COMMITTEE REPORT FOR THE PERIOD NOVEMBER 2005 TO APRIL 2006**

### **Full and Associate Membership**

On March 10, 2006, the committee confirmed that the Persatuan Aktuaris Indonesia now met the requirements for Full Member status and that, in accordance with the Rio Council motion, they were admitted as a Full Member as of that date.

The committee considered the application for Full Member status from the Serbian Actuaries Association and the application from the Macedonian Actuarial Association as an Associate Member. Motions recommending their admission have been included on the Council agenda of May 28, 2006.

A series of membership invitation letters were issued to actuarial associations not yet member of the IAA.

The Asociata Romana de Actuariat (Romania) and the Carribean Actuarial Association have expressed an interest to upgrade to Full Membership.

### **Membership Requirements**

The committee reviewed the recommendations prepared by the Task Force appointed to re-examine the membership requirements. Subject to discussion in Paris, and current Education Guidelines being re-expressed as requirements, the Task Force proposes that revised membership requirements be included on the 90 day agenda for the November 19, 2006 Council meeting in Edinburgh.

### **Non-Compliance to Membership Requirements**

From the meeting in Rio de Janeiro, the committee was asked to update the proposal and prepare a decision tree. The revised proposal was distributed to the committee for approval in Paris.

### **Confirmation Forms and Dues Outstanding**

One Full Member association has not yet submitted its 2004 and 2005 confirmation forms. Eleven member associations did not complete their annual confirmation form for 2005.

Dues from one of the Associate Members have been outstanding for the past four years and three years from two other Associate Members.

For both, outstanding confirmation forms and dues, the committee continues to send out reminders and follow-up with each member on an individual basis.
