

Minutes of IACA –EAAC meeting (Conference call)

May 23, 2005

3. Topics discussed

- a. Status of identifying speakers on three topics:

- ① On Morris Review---Helen Martin of Australian Institute was suggested as a possible speaker.(Brent will contact her and get her response ASAP.)
- ② On IFRS-----Hideyuki will try to confirm speakers from PwC in Asia Pacific region. The tentative joint speakers are, Michael Lockerman(Tokyo), Robert Fok(Hong Kong), and Hideyuki himself.
- ③ On pension issue-----Hideyuki has contacted a Japanese senior pension actuary, Ida-san. He will try to find a candidate within a week or so.

- b. Agus has explained the status of EAAC organizing committee.

- ① So far 26 topics and 18 papers have been received.
- ② The topics are classified into five areas: Modeling, Management, experience study, professionalism, and Market updates.
- ③ There are one plenary session(4 speakers need to be identified from other than the host country) and three parallel sessions:
- ④ IACA is assuming to take one parallel session in the afternoon of September 13: from 13:30pm to 16:00pm(Each speaker has about 30 minutes and Q&A after the speech)

- ⑤ Hideyuki will try to assume the role of chair person of the parallel session.
 - ⑥ Adrian later suggested that Brent will talk about IACA for about 20 minutes at the beginning of the session.
 - ⑦ Also, Agus has suggested that IACA may try to find one main speaker at the plenary session. It will be 90 minutes speech---No further discussions took place.
- c. Regarding the style of IACA presentation: Adrian later suggested to HY that instead of theory papers style which other EAAC presentations may follow, IACA speakers may use their own style which is “Power point presentation followed by discussions”.
- d. Next action steps:
- ① Finalize identifying speakers ASAP
 - ② Ask the speakers to submit the topics and slides to the EAAC secretary.
 - ③ Confirm if IACA can find a main speaker at the plenary session or not.
 - ④ Will there be IACA dinner the day before the session?
 - ⑤ Any other issues?
