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He is also a lecturer and researcher on health insurance matters at the Erasmus University in Rotterdam and an associate lecturer in health policy in the Institute of Public Administration in Dublin.

His primary research interests are in relation to the regulation of health insurance markets, the role of micro health insurance in developing countries and the costing of national health insurance and he has presented and published widely on these topics.

He has advised, under the auspices of the World Bank, the European Commission and the Inter-American Development Bank, the Governments of over twenty different countries on aspects of health reform, primarily in relation to health financing, the introduction of national health insurance and the use of risk equalisation and risk adjustment.

He is a member of the Council of the Society of Actuaries in Ireland, Chairman of its Demography Committee and a member of its Health and Social Policy Committee.

Recently he acted as lead editor for a series of papers on the topic of risk equalisation that was published in the journal 'Health Policy'.
